SECURITY RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Beach tags must be worn by all Members and Guests starting with children from seven (7) years of age, when using the Beach.
2. Tags for House Guests may be obtained from the Security Committee. Club Members will be held responsible for return of tags.
3. Day Guest Tags limited to six (6) per family, per day. Tags to be obtained the day Guests are present and must be returned same day. A Security Committee Member will distribute Guest Tags on the Patio of the Galley.

Guests not permitted on the Beach unless accompanied by, or introduced by a Club Member. Guests may remain on the Beach after being introduced by the Member to the Security Officer in charge in the event the Member has to leave the Beach.

4. Private Beach Parties to be held by permit only, limited to two (2) per family, per season. Parties to be held Monday through Thursday, only.
5. Privileges of the use of Club facilities shall always be extended to Officers, Associates and Guests of The Arthur D. Crane Company. All such persons shall display a Guest Badge upon request of the Security Officer.
6. Speed Limits in the Reservation to be 25 M.P.H., in the Beach Area 15 M.P.H.

2. No food or beverages to be consumed on the Beach
3. No dogs allowed on the Beach.
4. No undressing in cars or on Beach.
5. No fishing from Beach.
6. No boats on the Beach.
7. Make Reservations for private Beach Parties with Mrs. Wendell Inhoffer, Woodland Terrace, R.D. 3, Wharton, N.J., and obtain a Permit. (Telephone: HOpatcong 8-2509J)

Fire Permits must be obtained from Officer McAllister. The Beach must be policed after the party. NOTE: Picnicking and Picnic fires are permitted ONLY in the Picnic Area.
8. Front of cars must face curbing in Parking Area.
9. No Boat Trailers on the Beach or Parking Area.
10. No Ball Playing on the Beach - it will be permitted in the Play-ground area.
11. Members will be fully responsible for their Guests. Guests are to abide by the above Rules and Regulations and are subject to the Security Officer.
12. PLEASE USE THE TRASH CANS!
13. Please use ash trays when on Patio or All-Purpose Room.
14. Boats must be launched from north end of the Shore Docks.

Aluminum Boat Tags about three (3) inches in diameter with the Lake Forest Yacht Club imprinted and numbered will be furnished by Mr. Robert T. Crane free of charge to those members renting dock space from The Company. These tags would be permanent and not renewable yearly. Any other member owning a boat not moored at the Company docks, and who desires the Identification could purchase them for One Dollar (\$1.00). Therefore, please attach the tags on your boat, it would serve the member in proving identification of his own boat, and also would serve the Mooring Committee in connection with docking privileges. Also, in cooperation with the State Navigation Department, it would be an identification which they would find very useful in locating and returning boats that came adrift or that were taken without permission.

Again, we remind all boat men -- not to S P E E D in the Lagoon or the Docking Area!
