Wall Ball Court Wall Renovation!

It's been 30+ years since the wall ball court had new panels installed. Over the years there have been multiple repairs, patches and paint coats applied. On July 29th, a team of members replaced those old worn out panels with new ¾" Pressure Treated Plywood Panels.

We want to thank members: Andy Egan, Anthony Ortega, Bill Brown, Mike Kahwaty and Frank Gutowski who helped tear down the old panels and install the new panels. These pressure treated panels were quite heavy, so this team did an excellent job getting them lifted and placed on the frame foundation. Some reinforcement of the frame structure was aslo completed.

The wall is usable now but not yet complete. We need the pressure treated boards to dry out so that we can apply a coat of stain. The board would like to hear from members as to what color they would like the wall to be: Lake Forest Blue? Gray like on our clubhouse? Or the original Forest Green wall color? Share your thoughts with any trustee on the board.

We also will be placing a 4' size club logo near the top of the board so that it can be easily seen from the water.

Lake Forest Club Rules 2023

Please review the following club rules to help with smooth operations for our 2023 summer season. The Lake Forest Yacht Club grounds are intended for use solely by its members and their non-resident guests. All members have a responsibility to see that the following rules are adhered to during the year.

GENERAL:

- Use of this facility is at your own risk, lifeguards are there to help provide safety, but not guarantee it.
- Parents are responsible for their children's actions and will be held liable.
- All members and guests must be in possession of a LFYC beach badge with the current year sticker on it.
- Cars must display a LFYC hang tag with the current year sticker.
- LFYC is not responsible for lost or stolen property.
- Animals are welcome on LFYC property but are not permitted on the beach/sand and should be supervised at all times. PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG.
- No member or non-member may traverse or use any Lake Forest property, other than roadways and parking lots, with gas powered vehicles including, Motorcycles/Bikes or ATV's without the express permission of the Lake Forest Yacht Club. Any damage caused shall be responsibility of the individual using such vehicles.
- Use of the facility is permitted only in accordance with all Federal, State, and Local laws and ordinances.

WHEN A LIFEGUARD IS ON DUTY:

- Children 12 years and older are allowed to be on the beach and in the water. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied/supervised by a responsible guardian.

WHEN A LIFEGUARD IS NOT ON DUTY:

- All persons under 16 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible guardian, 16 years or older, when on the beach or swimming.

SWIMMING AND DIVING:

- Swimming is permitted in designated areas only and may be restricted by lifeguards at any time.
- High dive tower is off limits when the lifeguards are off duty.
- No pushing or shoving on the diving platform.
- Only one person is permitted on the diving board, high dive platform, or ladder at a time.
- Divers must dive forward off the board, not to the right or left.
- Exit the water via appropriate ladders. High dive to the right and low board to the left.

BEACH:

- Ball playing is prohibited, except in designated area i.e. volleyball area.
- Fires are not permitted on the beach/sand area.
- Motor vehicles and Bike Riding are not permitted in the beach/sand area.
- Fishing from sanded and posted areas is prohibited.
- Umbrellas, pop-up tents, etc. are not to obstruct the lifeguard's view and should not be placed beyond the line of the lifeguard's stand.
- Fold down umbrellas when not in use
- Trailers are not permitted in the beach parking area.
- Do not litter. Put all debris in the provided, marked containers.
- NO GLASS ALLOWED ON BEACH.

GUESTS:

- LFYC Members are responsible for their guests and must be present with them at all times.
- Limit of 10 guests per day. If you require additional guests, please check with the office.
- It's important to have the hang tag in your car and your badge with you and visible while on the property. Guests should have guest passes (available at the office, even when closed) visible on car dashboards and guests must be accompanied by a member while on club property. No person eligible to join LFYC may be a guest of a member. Gate keys are not to be provided to any nonmembers for their use without the owner of the key being present and again, No person eligible to join LFYC may be a guest of a member or use any portion of the club facilities. Boat trailers are not to be parked overnight in any of the club lots without prior permission from office and must be as far as possible from the boat ramp.

LFYC Trustee Meeting Minutes

Meeting Date: 7/13/23

Attendees: Frank, Keith, Peter, Pat, Kristen, Bryan

Called to Order: 7:03pm

Adjourned: 8:44pm

Frank:Commodore/Docks/Scholarship/Clubhouse

- New shower tower- Installed but not working properly. Manufacturer to be contacted
- 8 New Lifetime tables purchased to replace wooden picnic tables for under shade sails
- 2nd plaque for scholarship recipients purchased and to be installed
- AAA dock repair company will look at the B&C docks to see what needs to be repaired next year so budget line can be can adjusted
- Dock ramp to be inspected during draw down to see if repairs are needed
- Wall ball court repairs scheduled at 8:30am on 7/29. Logo on upper half of wall to be done
- Kegerator is leaking from inside the door, temperature adjusted and leak to be addressed
- Kitchen cabinets in clubhouse need to be cleaned out, outside spigot need to be repaired, pocket panel door needs tracks clean out for easier gliding. Commodore room door is stuck and will be fixed
- No room left on Trustee Plaque, will take down and reposition all the plates to give us another 20 plus years

Upcoming Club Projects:

- Glare shield for lamp light to be installed and adjust the B&C Dock lights
- Dive Tower fountain jets and tower spotlight:
 Pump working and fountain sprays work but issue is damaged pipe to pull water from lake.
 Blue 50-gallon barrel with 3" holes drilled on side and covered with screen to prevent clogging.

- Some new PVC Pipe. Plan to have this done by end of month.
- Spotlight at Tower: To be ordered and installed on 4 x 4 attached to pump area box. Photo sensor to illuminate flagpole at night. Flag remains up all season.
- Senior citizen member beach rail: to be installed
- Organization behind the galley
- Cleanup of area behind Commodore room
- Speakers / Sound system at Galley: Possible improvement for both stereo and speakers
- Sign up Genius is set up for small projects and supplies will be provided

- Attorney consulted in regards to Sales Tax disucssion. Club an charge Sales tax because our membership is optional
- Loan status reviewed and making good progress
