

### THE SPORTING LIFE.

Have you started to prepare for the ski season? If you have never skied before but you want to continue to enjoy the outdoors and have good aerobic and muscle toning fun, then crosscountry skiing is the way to go. Crosscountry skiing does not require the training and the costly equipment of downhill skiing, so it is much faster and more economical to start participating. Now is the time to start thinking about enjoying this great sport.

If you have never taken part in cross country skiing, or have not done so in a long while, I would suggest that you start by renting equipment. The places that rent equipment, and sell it, can help you choose the correct fit. Remember that in every sport where the equipment that you wear is directly used to participate, the fit is crucial. The results of improper fit may range from nothing more that a sore spot and a turn-off to the sport to a real disaster that causes injury. In this case there would probably be nothing more than sore feet.

There are places where you can take lessons, or, if you feel confident, you can do it on your own. Perhaps you have a friend who already knows how to crosscountry ski and can get you started. Just remember that if you can walk, you can do this kind of skiing. If you are someone who cannot walk but want to participate, then you already know that it will require some special modifications, but it can be done.

You have so many choices of what to do when you do crosscountry: You can go over a trail that has machine-set tracks, you can break your own trails on streets after a heavy snow fall,

you can break a trail in the woods on or off of a path, you can even go on downhill ski trails wit special skis and bindings.

Basically, crosscountry uses your skis in a fashion similar to skating and poles to help you push yourself along. Generally speaking, it is a kick and glide motion with the poles helping you to kick. Your feet are "bound" to the skis with bindings, but not in the rigid set of the downhill boot and binding, otherwise you could not move very well on the flat or nearly flat areas where you will ski. Crosscountry is sometimes referred to as Nordic skiing because it seems to come from the Norway and Sweden area.

Just as the weather could not keep you in the house this summer when you wanted to walk or run, the weather will not keep you in the house when you want to ski. Just as you had to adjust your clothing to the summer, you will have to adjust to the winter. When you crosscountry, you do not want to wear the same type of clothing that the downhillers wear because really is too warm. You want

to wear layers of light clothing that you can open or even remove easily and still have something on. It may be very cold, however, and the wind may be blowing so that it is very chilly on exposed skin. In other words, don't let yourself get frostbitten.

If you take up crosscountry, when next summer comes you can get back on the road as though you never had a break, and you will have had some marverlous times staying in shape. I'll look for you as I ski around the area this winter.

### JIM'S GARDEN SPOT-

This is leaf rakin' month. It is very important not to let fallen leaves remain too long on your lawn, paved surfaces, or vehicles. On your lawn, they form a mat that suffocates the grass. When leaves are wet, they release acids that can stain concrete, paving stones and damage vehicle paint.


Now is a perfect time to transplant shrubs and evergreens. It's also a good time to get great bargains on shrubs and evergreens from local garden centers.

This month is the time for planting bulbs for spring flowers. For the most dramatic effect, pla the bulbs in clusters of 10 to 30 depending on the size of the flowers. I plant 25 to 30 crocus bulbs a cluster.

I've been told that shaking bulbs in medicated baby powder keeps squirrels and other anima from digging them up and eating them. I'm going to try it for the first time this year. I know th laying a lose meshed fencing over the bulbs is 100% effective.

Don't forget to wash your flower pots thoroughly before putting them away for next year. Ne plants like a clean environment.

New leaf collection bags are being used this year in Jefferson Township. Last year's plastic le collection bags have been replaced by a recyclable paper bag. If you have bags you purchased fro the township left over from last year you may turn them in for this year's new paper bags—stop the municipal garage to exchange them. Leaves left in last year's plastic bags will not be picked u


