


LANE LINES - News of the Lake Forest Swim Team

5-Year Drawdown Info for Lk. Forest Residents

The Lake Hopatcong Regional Planning Bd has asked us to pass along this information to you:

As you may be aware, 1992 is the scheduled year for the five-year major drawdown of Lake Hopatcong. The schedule for the drawdown is as follows:

1) The drawdown will start on approx. Sept. 9, and be conducted at a rate of approx. one inch per day. This rate will vary based on ongoing rainfall.

2) By Sept. 30, the Lake should be down approx. 2 ft.—about the lowest level the lake can be used for recreational navigation—most boats should be out of the lake by this time.

3) The maximum five ft. level should be reached by Oct. 31. The lake will remain at this level for repairs to docks, etc. until Dec. 15.

4) On Dec. 15, the dam will be returned to the minimum flow and the lake level allowed to rise. The "fill-up" will stop for the winter when solid ice conditions are achieved. We hope to gain a headstart on the fill-up of approx. 12-18 inches prior to the onset of solid ice.

5) Immediately after the ice breaks for the shore in late winter or Mar 1, 1993, whichever is earlier, the lake level will be brought up for the 1993 season. Full lake level, depending on

rain, should be reached by May 1.

You should be advised that state and local permits are needed for any dock or seawall construction and that state permits are needed for any dredging activities.
