

NEWSWATCH

Finding a suitable site for a dump or resource recovery facility has been the subject of month's of debate in Morris County. NEWSWATCH has reported the county's progress toward this end:

 decision to use incineration as the means of disposal and steam generation

2. Picatinny Arsenal's refusal to accept the plant on its property although it was interested in being the recipient of the steam generated by it

3. County Consultant Bechtel's choice of 8 sites including one at Taylor Rd. & Rt. 15 in Jefferson

4. Montville's opposition to the siting of the incinerator there although Bechtel found it most suitable of all the 8 county sites

The impasse thus created was relieved when SWAC (Solid Waste Advisory Council) asked their consultants to look into 3 possible sites in Jefferson. The township's "remote" position and "low population density" were cited as important factors in their choices.

Two of the sites—at Tri-County Asphalt which owns and operates the quarry at the northern end of Lake Hopatcong above Woodport Cove—are generating a lot of interest because the Tri-County Asphalt Co. has informed SWAC that it would welcome the incinerator on its property. Access to those sites would be via Rt. 15 north to the Lake Forest exit and north on Rt. 181. Both Tri-County sites are on the southern (Lake Hopatcong) slope of the property.

The following letter from Township Administrator Bowden clarifies many points. The LFYC Trustees have made the information he refers to available at the LFYC office.

Under previous cover, I sent you all the information currently available relative to the possible construction of a Resource Recovery Facility in Jefferson Township.

As indicated in the information, the Morris County Board of Chosen Freeholders and the Solid Waste Advisory Council (5)C) will be investigating three (3) sites in Jefferson in the following areas:

1. Compton-Gobel Road (Lake Shawnee)

2. Tri-County Quarry (site has two options; one in Jefferson and one in Hopatcong)
In Jefferson-Rockaway Town

3. Route 15 South (near Jefferson-Rockaway Township border)

The Mayor and Township Council is unanimous in their opposition to the location of a Resource Recovery Facility any-

where in Jefferson Township.

To help evaluate the negative impacts of each of these three (3) sites, the Township has hired a private consulting firm by name of ESEI/Ecolsciences, Inc. of Rockaway, New Jersey. This firm has already started work on this report.

Two upcoming dates are extremely important for the purpose of challenging a Resource Recovery Facility in Jefferson as a means of showing public opposition to such a facility.

The first date is June 18, 1984. At this time, the Mayor and Council will be conducting a meeting at Stanlick School in Lake Shawnee to solicit public input on this subject and review the preliminary findings of the private consultants. This meeting will begin at 8:00, p.m.

The second date is <u>June 20, 1984</u>. This is the date of the next SWAC meeting, which will be held in Morristown at the County Courthouse, Freeholders Meeting Room, beginning at

7.30 p.m.

It is essential that as many Township residents as possible attend both these meetings and express their opinions. Because of this, I am asking your assistance in notifying as many residents as you can that belong to your community association of the date of these meetings and the importance of their attendance.

If I can be of any assistance in this matter, please do not hesitate to contact my office.






NEWS TO PUZZLE FIND


