THE SPORTING LIFE

We are now well into autumn and the nights are much longer than the days. It is time to think about what was accomplished this past summer, what to do to maintain the level of activity attained, and what are goals for the future.

I saw many new runners and walkers out on the roads around our lake area this past summer. Some that I saw running had been walkers for a long time, so they had changed their training. Remember, though, whether you walk or run, the important point is to set your goals and move toward them.

If you want to keep out on the roads during the fall and winter, you have to change your approach because of the darkness, the temperature, and other climatic conditions. In most cases you can stay outdoors to do your aerobic activities. The extended darkness requires thinking about being seen. Unless you have a particular reason not to let the cars see you as you use the roads, you need to wear things that make you stand out. Most good shoes for running have reflectors on them. A reflective vest is very good inexpensive item, it is hard not to see. There are some inexpensive clothes, especially jackets, made especially for running or walking at night, that have reflective strips right on them. The amount of reflective area is not as great as the vest. Now there are some rather expensive jackets and shorts that are made entirely of reflective material. You can also buy shoelaces that are reflective. Carrying a flashlight is useful if you want to see what the road conditions are, or if you want to look at things. Generally, however, if you are concentrating on your training you will want to have

your hands free, especially if you are running. I have not covered all of the ways that you can be seen on the road, but at least it is a starting point.

Dressing for the weather is very important. DO NOT underdress and be susceptible to frost-bite. The temperature may be around freezing or below, and, even if the wind is not blowing, runners generate their own breeze. Dress in layers, including a windbreaker, just as for x-country skiing. I particularly like turtleneck sweaters. You should not wear heavy, bulky clothes. Whether you are walking or running,

you will raise the output of your internal furnace and start to sweat. You want that perspiration to be able to evaporate. There are clothes made of materials that help to remove the moisture that you develop, this helps to keep you from getting chilled. As you get used to dressing this way, you will probably find that you will do that even if you are going outdoors for other reasons, even work.

Another real problem to watch for is ice on the roads. As a runner or walker, you must think about the problems of a car driver as well as your own. It is very hard to maintain control of a car on the ice. You, being on the road and seeing the headlights must make allowances for the driver's problems. A driver forced to stop on a slick street may slide, or an unseen ice patch may cause the driver to lose control.

If you use common sense when on the road and dress properly, you can continue right through the winter. When warm weather arrives again you will not have lost any of the gains that you had made this season.



JIM'S GARDEN SPOT

For most of us, this will be the final month for raking leaves. Be sure to get all of the leaves off the grass. Leaves make very good mulch for protecting perennial plants and newly planted bulbs. Pile up about a foot of dry leaves over areas that you want to protect. The purpose of this is prevent freezing and thawing sequences. Once bulbs or perennials freeze, they should stay frozen for as long as possible. Salt hay is also another very good material to us to prevent alternate freezing and thawing.

After you have completed your final leaf clean up, it is a perfect time to apply the last application of fertilizer. This should be done prior to the grass going dormant. Applying winterizer fertilizer gives your lawn needed nutrients for the winter months and gives it a jump start for the spring.

If you have a problem with snow mold—that matted, spider web stuff on your grass after the snow melts—November is the time for treatment. The treatment is quite expensive, but may save your lawn and a lot of back breaking raking in the spring. It might be a good idea to speak with Bob at Mohawk Gardens in Sparta about your problem prior to applying the necessary fungicide. Don't forget to winterize your lawn mower and sharpen the blade prior to putting it to sleep for the winter. Be sure to run all of the gas out of the tank.

Always wear rubber gloves when working with fertilizers and pesticides. Wear a dust mask or respirator when spraying.




