### **COMMODORE'S MESSAGE**

We have our Semi-Annual Meeting on Friday, May 5<sup>th</sup> at 8 PM. This is an opportunity for members to receive updates from the trustees on club operations and the many projects the board has undertaken to improve the club. We will also be announcing the recipient of the 2023 LFYC Scholarship at the meeting. We hope you can join us for this meeting.

I want to thank all the members who volunteered for our Beach Clean-up on April 15<sup>th</sup>. It was a good turnout where we accomplished most of the tasks needed for opening the beach for the season on May 27<sup>th</sup>. We weren't able to get the painting and picnic table stain applied due

to rain forecasted that day. We hope to get volunteers to apply stain to the picnic tables prior to the beach season opener. I also want to thank Keith Moran for organizing the volunteers for the beach cleanup event.

You'll also notice our landscaper completed the Geese Remediation project along A, B and C Docks by replacing the grass with weed fabric and river rocks. We believe this will minimize goose droppings on those walkways as well as having a new aesthetically pleasing appearance. We also completed the Clubhouse Façade repair on April 22<sup>nd</sup>, where we had an excellent turnout of volunteers. We not only replaced the façade, we also had other projects completed as well. More details including before and after photos on those repairs are on page 7 in this Porthole.

There are many additional projects that will be undertaken over the next several months to continue to update and improve our property that will continue to need member volunteers to help. Some of it is as simple as scraping old cracked paint off the clubhouse and applying a fresh coat of paint. We want to accommodate members who want to help but unable to help us on scheduled project dates. The trustees are working out the logistics to make the tools and paint available for members who want to help out on their own schedule. More details will be forthcoming.

Our next club social event is the largest we have each year: Opening Day Picnic on May 27<sup>th</sup>. Kristen Brown and the Social Committee are coordinating the event activities and need some volunteer help to manage the event. More details are on page 3 of this Porthole along with a Signup Genius link for member volunteers to help on select tasks. Please volunteer to help, because we can't execute these types of social events without help from member volunteers.

I want to remind longtime members, as well as new members, of the LFYC rules for access to the property and facilities. Only residents who live in the Lake Forest boundaries may be members of the club. Some residents who are our neighbors and friends choose not to be members of the club for their own personal reasons. Being a non-member resident prohibits them from accessing our club property and using any club facilities. Members who provide these non member residents access to our club facilities for their own personal use is circumventing club rules and infringes on all LFYC members that pay dues for access to club facilities. The Lake Forest Board of Trustees is obligated to enforce these membership rules and address violations when reported by members.

I look forward to seeing our members at the Semi Annual meeting and at the Opening Day Picnic later this month.

Weekend operations will begin mid-May until school is out and then daily operations begin through Labor Day Weekend. Lifeguard training and a Red Cross Certificate including Waterfront are required before beginning employment. Lifeguard training/certification will be held at LFYC, date TBD. # **Beach Rules 2023**

Please review the following beach rules to help with smooth operations for our 2023 summer season. The Lake Forest Yacht Club grounds are intended for use solely by its members and their non-resident guests. All members have a responsibility to see that the following rules are adhered to during the year.

### **GENERAL:**

- Use of this facility is at your own risk, lifeguards are there to help provide safety, but not guarantee it.
- Parents are responsible for their children's actions and will be held liable.
- All members and guests must be in possession of a LFYC beach badge with the current year sticker on it.
- Cars must display a LFYC hang tag with the current year sticker.
- LFYC is not responsible for lost or stolen property.
- Animals are welcome on LFYC property but are not permitted on the beach/sand and should be supervised at all
- times. PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG.
- Use of the facility is permitted only in accordance with all Federal, State, and Local laws and ordinances.

### WHEN A LIFEGUARD IS ON DUTY:

- Children 12 years and older are allowed to be on the beach and in the water. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied/supervised by a responsible guardian.

### WHEN A LIFEGUARD IS NOT ON DUTY:

- All persons under 16 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible guardian, 16 years or older, when on the beach or swimming.

### **SWIMMING AND DIVING:**

- Swimming is permitted in designated areas only and may be restricted by lifeguards at any time.
- High dive tower is off limits when the lifeguards are off duty.
- No pushing or shoving on the diving platform.
- Only one person is permitted on the diving board, high dive platform, or ladder at a time.
- Divers must dive forward off the board, not to the right or left.
- Exit the water via appropriate ladders. High dive to the right and low board to the left.

### **BEACH:**

- Ball playing is prohibited, except in designated area i.e. volleyball area.
- Fires are not permitted on the beach/sand area.
- Motor vehicles are not permitted in the beach/sand area.

- Bike riding is not permitted in the beach/sand area.
- Fishing from sanded and posted areas is prohibited.
- Umbrellas, pop-up tents, etc. are not to obstruct the lifeguard's view and should not be placed beyond the line
- of the lifeguard's stand.
- Trailers are not permitted in the beach parking area.
- Do not litter. Put all debris in the provided, marked containers.
- NO GLASS ALLOWED ON BEACH.

### **GUESTS:**

- LFYC Members are responsible for their guests and must be present with them at all times.
- Guests must have 1 day parking pass.
- No person eligible to join LFYC may be a guest of a member
- Limit of 10 guests per day. If you require additional guests, please check with the office.

Volunteers are still needed on this committee to set the beach season concessions menu and source inventory.



The ideal member volunteers would be from families who frequent the beach and concession stand during the summer. They know what members like to order at the stand and are the best source for identifying and securing the in demand concessions. Also being savvy shoppers for best deals to help minimize cost to our members.

The committee would run from early May through Labor Day and be asked to:

- 1. Set menu of concessions to be sold. Drinks, Snacks, Candy, Ice Cream, etc....
- 2. Set affordable concession pricing for our members based on inventory cost.
- 3. Source the concession items for startup and weekly inventory maintenance. Shopping at the Wholesale stores like Costco and our local grocery stores. Being the savvy shopper to load up on those sale items.
- 4. Weekly reimbursements from club office on inventory purchased.

The committee will not be tasked to run the concession stand. We will have hired help to do that. We just need volunteer member oversight on inventory selection and keeping the concession stocked through the season from Memorial Day Weekend to Labor Day.

Once again, on behalf of club membership, thank you to all the member volunteers we had this weekend to execute these projects.








Sun Shade Sail Project Project Date: Saturday May 13th

# 2023 Kayak Rack Slip Rentals

We still have some slips available on our kayak racks for the season. The rental season starts on April  $\mathbf{1}^{st}$  and concludes on October  $\mathbf{31}^{st}$ . The Kayak

Only Kayaks, Stand Up Paddleboards (SUP) and Canoes may be stored on the racks. None may be stored on the ground. Members that would like to



rent a slip on the kayak rack need to complete the kayak rack rental agreement and provide the rental fee payment of \$25 for the season. Each renter will receive a Kayak Storage Permit sticker to attach to their vessel. Each sticker is individually numbered for member identification of property.

Reach out to the club office to rent a slip as numbered in the image above as well as on the kayak racks. Kayak rack slips 31 to 36 is reserved exclusively for SUP's. All other kayak slips are open for kayaks, SUP or canoes. Just like how we manage our dock rentals, members who rent in 2023 will have first right to renew for the following year.

# **BEST PRACTICES: To Keep our Club Clean!**

- Please remember our club operates with volunteers and everyone's help is needed to keep it maintained!
- Be sure your trash and recycling makes its way to the appropriate bins at the beach, playground, galley, restrooms, patio, and field while enjoying the property.
- Do <u>not</u> overfill the trash and recycling bins or leave <u>any</u> items next to or on top of the bins.
- Place pizza boxes directly in the recycling dumpster do not stuff into recycling bins.
- If you see trash on the ground, please be kind and pick it up.
- If trash or recycling is full and you are able to take it to the dumpster, the help is much appreciated.
- Smoking is not permitted on the beach or near the galley or picnic tables. Cigarette butts are not to be left on the ground anywhere on the property, including the parking lots.
- Please refrain from moving adirondack chairs, picnic tables, benches. It causes unnecessary wear and tear on these items.
- Close umbrellas in high wind, if a storm is incoming, or when leaving.
- TVs in the galley are continuously being left on overnight. Remotes are provided on the counter for your use – they must be turned off before leaving.

It's important to have the hang tag in your car and your badge with you and visible while on the property.

Guests should have guest passes (available at the office, even when closed) visible on car dashboards and guests must be accompanied by a member while on club property. Gate keys are not to be provided to any non-members for their use without the owner of the key being present. Boat trailers are not to be parked overnight in any of the club lots without prior permission from office, and must be as far as possible from the boat ramp.
