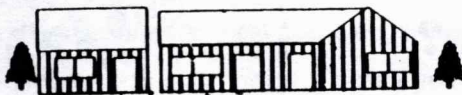

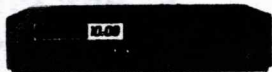

LYME DISEASE PREVENTION

A Notice from the Jefferson Township Health Department

Although Lyme disease has been reported from 47 states, New Jersey is one of the eight states reporting over 90 percent of all cases nationwide. Morris County is now the second highest county at risk with this tick-borne disease. Recent statistics show the number of cases reported per county.

Hunterdon County	565 cases reported; case rate of 491 per 100,000 residents
Morris County	232 cases reported; case rate of 53 per 100,000 residents
Somerset County	177 cases reported; case rate of 68 per 100,000 residents
Warren County	50 cases reported; case rate of 62 per 100,000 residents

To protect your family, the Board of Health suggests you follow the guidelines below:

Wear light-colored clothing covering legs and arms.

Tuck pants into socks and wear closed shoes.

Apply tick repellent containing DEET or permethrin. Follow label instructions.

Check your body for ticks when coming in from outdoors.

If you find a tick promptly grasp tick with tweezers as close to skin as possible. Pull backward applying firm, steady pressure. Clean area with antiseptic. Save tick in jar with moist paper towel for identification by local health department, or call the Rutgers Coop. Ext.- Agricultural Dept.

Early diagnosis is important. Consult your physician as soon as symptoms appear, usually 1-2 weeks after the tick bite. Early symptoms include a red expanding rash that grows bigger than 2", often appearing as a bullseye. Flue-like symptoms, fatigue, muscle aches, low-grade fever, chills, headache. Second stage symptoms can occur weeks or months later and include: Severe headaches, encephalitis, paralysis of facial muscles, abnormal heartbeat, numbness, withdrawal, loss of confidence lethargy, etc. Third stage symptoms occur months or years later and include: arthritis, fatigue and loss of memory. Early detection is your best defense. Be vigilant and cautious.

TAKING A GARDEN INVENTORY

GARDENING TIPS

With this issue Lake Forest's Jim McGraw begins a column using knowledge he's gleaned from years of gardening at his Lake Forest home.

I would like to remind you that August and early September are good months to take inventories.

Inventory your garden supplies —garden centers start running clearance sales on all types thought that I would pass on a few gardening pointers I have discovered which could save you time, money, and heartache. The following tips have been time tested. This month I'd of lawn and garden products at substantial savings. You may find many of the products you'll need in the following year for as much as 50% off.

Now is also a favorable time to take inventory of the plants that you will need next spring. Obviously, you are not going to purchase plants now, but it's a perfect time to write down the plants you will want —both quantities and colors. By doing this now, you will save a lot of time and head scratching next spring.

Garden centers also run great sales on perennials, shrubs and trees starting in mid-September. Bulbs for spring flowers can be purchased at big savings if you shop around. All of these are best planted in the late summer or fall. Watch the advertisements and flyers in the paper—usually after Labor Day. If you have trouble with squirrels digging up and eating your bulbs, after planting, put light weight fencing over them. The technical name of the fencing that I use is 1/2" hardware cloth. This can be purchased at hardware stores or lumber yards. Remember to remove the fencing after the snow melts in the spring. Don't let the plants start to grow through the fencing.

A rule of thumb is not to prune/trim azaleas after mid-July. They start setting buds for the following year about that time. There is a strong risk of cutting off newly formed buds by pruning after July 15th.
